Cricklewood Business Strategy:

Cricklewood Library:

Sally gave an update on progress regarding the very exciting planned new library in Gladstone Park and the need for £35k to complete the budget to fit out the space.

A safer Cricklewood:

Stuart mentioned LJAGS in Brent – Local Joint Action Groups where decisions are made on how best to resolve local concerns regarding ASB anti-social behaviour and local crime. Stuart will let us know how we can become involved in our local LJAG where local businesses can raise their concerns about e.g. drug misuse and related behaviour, begging and general ASB issues.

CCTV:

We will invite Councillor Leads (from the three boroughs) on Stronger Communities to our next meeting to discuss how our Association can tackle ASB and find ways of preventing it.
