Business Strategy: Members agreed to develop a 20 year strategy for the Broadway. For starters – Shelley will attempt to find the Exit Strategy that was produced by Robin Lee Architects (partner in the Outer London Fund project which ended in 2014) The strategy will be a useful starting point for our 20 year vision document Shelley and Matt will provide current examples of businesses strategies from Brent and Barnet town Centres Shelley and Matt will coordinate desk research on Cricklewood and the local economy David Rowley Carpet Time, Kaveh Savage from Savage London, Danny Maher and Eoin Pardy will meet to facilitate the development of the strategy Dave suggests and agreed to print Cricklewood Business Association business cards to distribute to all business as a way of promoting the association Other thoughts on this issue included Members will look out for potential funding programmes – e.g. Local Councils, Central Government, other statutory agencies that may support the cost of a consultant Andrew from Argent suggested he would invite a key member of the Brent X development to our next meet who could bring the Membership up to-date on when we will see the first developments taking place and areas affected as a means of informing our 20 year vision Matthew mentioned that his colleague, Claire Jones in Brent Council may be able to offer advise on our strategy Members agreed that both Barnet and Brent should be approached for funding for the strategy development

Funding: Community Infrastructure Levy

Shelley will report information on Barnet CIL programme at our next meeting. Brent Council has currently a CIL funding programme available for application

Osita told Members about a CIL bid she is leading on behalf of the Cricklewood Town Team (resident led group) to next meeting which if successful will see the creation of a public space on Oakland's Road where shoppers and residents can relax, enjoy an active space.

Shop fronts – Cllr. Lia introduced the idea of a shop fronts clean up initiative. More on this story later in the week.

Members agreed that Cricklewood Business Association membership be dependent on the applicant business signing up for their shop to be cleaned by this initiative

Kaveh asked for more copies of the leaflet which he will pass on to his neighbours.

AOB:

PC Eton reported that the "No drinking zone" in the whole of Barnet has been removed by the council as of last week. This is very disappointing news as we have seen a marked difference in a reduction of ASB and drinking on our green space and around the Broadway, Barnet side. The No Drinking Zone had given the police leverage and more grounds to tackle street drinkers and nip any potential ASB problems in the bud before they began. Elton said that they would continue to patrol the area when they. Members agreed that a letter should be sent to the Borough Commander reporting our disappointment and requesting that the Zone be restored. Action. Danny Maher
