Unsafe electrical appliances. The magazine 'Which' reports that they found dozens of dangerous USB chargers, travel adapters and power banks listed for sale on AliExpress, Amazon Marketplace, eBay and Wish that could cause fires or potentially harm people - including electrocution. Buying cheap products from brands you don't recognise could come at a cost to your safety. Nearly three-quarters of the 33 unbranded or unknown brand products they purchased from online marketplaces failed their electrical safety tests.
